





The Significance of Prayer and Blessings in Healing Ministry By Deb Reis

A healing ministry practice includes prayer, laying on of hands, and anointing. The past two articles went into greater depth on what is meant by laying on of hands and anointing. This article dives into prayer. The early Christians identified prayer, laying on of hands, and anointing as one act to be done for one another as part of a community.

Prayer, a cornerstone of Judeo-Christian spiritual practice for millennia, is a vital link between humanity and the divine. Its historical significance is evident throughout the Bible, where prayer is depicted as an essential aspect of Jewish life. Through prayer, believers express their deepest needs and desires, seeking physical healing, spiritual renewal, and emotional comfort.

Blessings, closely related to prayer, are another powerful aspect of healing ministry. Blessings are seen as a way to invoke God's favor and protection over an individual. When used in a healing context, blessings can reinforce the spiritual support offered by prayer, reassuring those in distress. The act of blessing someone, often accompanied by prayer, laying on of hands, or anointing with oil, symbolizes the presence of God's love and mercy, fostering a sense of peace and hope.

The practices of laying on hands, anointing, and prayer have deep historical roots in Judeo-Christian traditions. They serve as tangible expressions of divine grace. These practices are rich in symbolism and spiritual significance, creating a profound connection between the individual, the community, and God. In a healing ministry, they offer more than just physical relief; they provide a holistic approach to healing that addresses the body, mind, and spirit.

In conclusion, prayer and blessings are essential elements of a healing ministry, offering comfort, guidance, and a sense of divine presence to those in need. Through these practices, believers seek to experience and share God's healing power, reinforcing the deep connections that bind us to the divine and one another. As we engage in these sacred acts, we are reminded of the profound impact spiritual practices can have on our journey toward wholeness and well-being.

"When a country grows prosperous, people tend to think their prosperity will last forever —and that it makes them superior. They lose their heads and spend lavishly on themselves.

God said to the people in a situation like that, "Is it a time for you yourselves to be living in your paneled houses, while [my] house remains a ruin?" (Haggai 1:4). Self-centeredness leads to short-changing God and others in many ways, including the use of our income.

And, mysteriously, the bubble can burst. The center of prosperity can shift—from England, to America, to Japan, to China. Wealth slips out of our hands; "good jobs" dry up; hard times come. We "earn wages, only to put them in a purse with holes in it" (Haggai 1:6).

Christians have often debated the question of tithes. Since Christ came and fulfilled the Old Testament law, must we still give 10 percent of our income to God? Some give a smaller percentage, since 5 percent of a large income is greater than 10 percent of a small income. But Jesus was more impressed by a poor woman's gift of all she had than by the large gifts of wealthy people (Luke 21:1-4). "God loves a cheerful giver ... and is able to bless you abundantly" (2 Corinthians 9:7-8). Ultimately, all that we have belongs to [God] (Psalm 24:1). So ... what amount of giving
